Zimbabwe - SADC Trade Brief

1. SADC Overview

The Southern African Development Community (SADC) is a Regional Economic Community comprising 16 Member States; Angola, Botswana, Comoros, Democratic Republic of Congo, Eswatini, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, Seychelles, South Africa, United Republic of Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

The mission of SADC is to promote sustainable and equitable economic growth and socio-economic development through efficient, productive systems, deeper cooperation and integration, good governance and durable peace and security; so that the region emerges as a competitive and effective player in international relations and the world economy.

2. Key Economic Indicators



Key Trade Partners: China, USA, India, United Arab Emirates, and Russia










3. Zimbabwe - SADC Trade

SADC is Zimbabwe's largest trading bloc in terms of exports and imports. The country exported products worth US\$2.86 billion in 2023 to SADC countries up from US\$2.78 billion in 2018. South Africa is Zimbabwe's largest trading partner within SADC accounting for 78% of Zimbabwe's exports to the SADC region. (refer to Annex 1)


Zimbabwe's imports from SADC amounted to US\$4.51 billion in 2023 up from US\$3.15 billion in 2014 translating to an 87% increase over the past 10 years. (refer to Annex 2)



4. Zimbabwe's exports to the SADC region

Zimbabwe mainly exports minerals (35%), tobacco (7%), building materials (11%) and coal (7%) to SADC. (Refer to Annex 3)





5. Zimbabwean Products with Potential to the SADC region

- a) Agricultural Products:
 - Tobacco
 - Cotton
 - Tea
 - Coffee
 - Fresh fruits (oranges, grapes, berries)
 - Flowers (roses, carnations)









6. SADC Trade performance by Country

SADC's total exports amounted to US\$231 billion in 2023 up from US\$199 billion recorded in 2014 translating to a 16% increase over the past 10 years. Major exporters in the region include South Africa recording US\$110 billion thereby accounting for 48% of SADC's exports. Angola recorded US\$38 billion accounting for 17% of SADC's exports, whilst Zimbabwe recorded US\$7.2 billion exports accounting for 3% of SADC exports. (Refer to Annex 5)




SADC's imports amounted to US\$223 billion in 2023 up from US\$200 billion recorded in 2014 translating to a 12% increase over the 10-year period. Major importers in the region include South Africa US\$107 billion accounting for 48% of SADC's imports, followed by DRC US\$25.7 billion accounting for 11% and Tanzania with 7% of imports. Zimbabwe accounts for 4% for SADC's imports. (refer to Annex 7)



7. SADC Intra Trade

Intra – SADC trade ranges from 16% to 20% highlighting the need to continue trading within the bloc using the existing trade agreement.



8. Issues to consider

Key issues to consider for increasing trade between Zimbabwe and the SADC region:



- Simplify trade regulations and procedures similar to the COMESA Simplified Trade Regime.
- Increase Market Access and Promotion through conducting market research and analysis for products with potential in SADC countries.
- Increase collaboration among trade promotional agencies through participation in regional trade fairs and exhibitions
- Collaboration of member states in coming up with digital platforms for market access.
- Improve Financial and Payment Systems at SADC level and Improving access to finance for exporters.
- Develop and utilize regional payment systems
- Develop Infrastructure: Upgrade transportation infrastructure (air, land, and sea) to facilitate trade.

9. Conclusion

Zimbabwe's membership in the Southern African Development Community (SADC) presents significant opportunities for economic growth, regional integration, and cooperation. Zimbabwe is making progress in increasing trade with SADC countries, with South Africa, Mozambique, and Zambia being key trading partners.







Annex 6: Zimbabwe Export Potential to SADC



The products with greatest export potential from Zimbabwe to Southern Africa are Cotton, not carded/combed, Diamonds, unworked, and Chromium ores & concentrates. Diamonds, unworked shows the largest absolute difference between potential and actual exports in value terms, leaving room to realize additional exports worth \$28 million.
