Zimbabwe – United States of America Trade Brief

1. USA Overview

With a GDP of approximately US\$27.36 trillion in 2023, the United States of America is the world's largest economy, accounting for approximately 25% of global GDP. It has a diverse and dynamic economy, driven by services, technology, and consumer spending. It is a federal union of 50 states and a federal district (Washington, D.C). The 48 contiguous states, border Canada to the north and Mexico to the south, with the states of Alaska to the northwest and the archipelagic Hawaii in the Pacific Ocean. The United States also asserts sovereignty over five major island territories and various uninhabited islands.

The country has the world's third-largest land area, largest exclusive economic zone, and third-largest population, exceeding 334 million.



3. Zimbabwe - USA Trade

USA imported products worth US\$69.5 million from Zimbabwe in 2024 down from US\$119 million recorded in 2023. USA imports from Zimbabwe include tobacco US\$42, sugar US\$14 million, Coffee, tea, maté and spices US\$5 million and Works of art, collectors' pieces and antiques US\$2 million. 
USA exports to Zimbabwe amounted to US\$43 million in 2024 a marginal increase from US\$37.6 million recorded in 2023. USA major exports to Zimbabwe are machinery and mechanical appliances. (Refer to Annex 2)



4. USA Imports from SADC by Country

USA imports from SADC countries amounted to US\$40.6 billion in 2024 up from US\$24.4 billion in 2020 translating to a compound annual growth rate of 10.7%. This also mean that Zimbabwe is supplying less than 1% to USA out of their total requirements from SADC. This may be a result of Zimbabwe not being a beneficiary of the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA) trade agreement which is a market access agreement.

From the SADC countries, South Africa is the major exporter to the USA with 37% amounting to US\$14.9 billion followed by Nigeria with 14% amounting to US\$5.8 billion. Meanwhile SADC only supplies 1% of USA total imports. (*Refer to Annex 3*)

Minerals constitute 49% of USA's imports from SADC, followed by vehicles and parts amounting to US\$2.2 billion which is 11% of their total imports from SADC. USA is





also a major importer of clothing from SADC countries with a combined figure of over US\$657 million, while imports of edible fruit and nuts including peel of citrus fruit or melons from SADC countries amounted to US\$272 million. Imports of coffee, tea, maté and spices from SADC countries amounted to US\$18 million, highlighting a huge market that Zimbabwe can also tap into.

6. Zimbabwe Products with Potential in USA

a. Iron and Steel:

Trend: USA imports iron and steel worth over US\$33 billion per year and of that amount SADC countries supply US\$575 million. This shows that there is an opportunity to supply iron and steel into USA.

Opportunity: Zimbabwe is in the process of developing a largest iron and steel plant in Africa in Manhize under the Dinson Iron and Steel Company. Phase one production has started with a capacity of 600,000 tonnes per year, while phase two production will begin in 2025 with a production capacity of planned expansion to produce 1.2 million tonnes annually. The final phase has a planned production capacity of 5 million tonnes annually, focusing on a variety of steel products hence these products will require extensive markets such as the USA.

b. Edible fruits, vegetables and nuts:

Trend: USA imports over US\$24 billion of edible fruits and vegetables, US\$258 million of which is from SADC countries. Currently, Zimbabwe is exporting macadamia nuts to Asia, and this presents an opportunity to diversify the markets.

Opportunity: Zimbabwe can competitively supply to the USA as the country is currently supplying markets in Europe and China. There are new citrus plantations in Zimbabwe such as Dodhill, Bishopstone Estate, Nottingham Estate and Tineo which can effectively tap into the US market. The clusters being developed by ZimTrade can also tap into the market.

c. Garments

Trend: USA imports articles of apparel and clothing accessories worth over US\$678 million from SADC countries out of total imports amounting to US\$81 billion.

Opportunity: Zimbabwe has a growing industry of garments. Companies actively looking for export markets include Paramount Garments, Tripple Tee Footwear and Tiplong Trading. Leather companies can also export leather related apparels.

d. Coffee, Tea, Maté, and Spices

Trend: USA imports of coffee, tea, maté, and spices from SADC amounted to US\$218 million in 2023 out of total import bill of US\$10.5 billion.







Opportunity: Zimbabwe has been introducing new ranges of indigenous offerings like Zumbani and Moringa which could capture interest within this niche. Given the emergence of demand for new, health-oriented teas and herbal products, positioning these as immune-boosting and wellness-enhancing alternatives can differentiate Zimbabwean exports from common products like black tea. Strategic partnerships with specialty tea importers or direct-to-consumer branding can boost their appeal in the herbal tea segment.

e. Industrial Hemp

USA introduced the Farm Bill in 2018 which legalized the cultivation of industrial hemp at the federal level, removing it from the Controlled Substances Act. This has opened new opportunities for farmers and businesses. Zimbabwe also legalized the cultivation of industrial hemp, recognizing its potential for economic growth and diversification. Zimbabwe can tap into the USA value chains of the products below:

- Hemp Fiber: Used in textiles, paper, and construction materials.
- **Hemp Seed:** A nutritious food source rich in protein and omega-3 fatty acids.
- **Hemp Oil:** Used in cosmetics, food, and medicine.
- Cannabidiol (CBD) Oil: A non-psychoactive compound with potential medicinal benefits. There is also scope increase tobacco exports currently being done from Zimbabwe and encourage exports of medicinal tobacco.) (Refer to Annex 4)


7. USA Trade Performance

USA exported products worth US\$2.06 trillion in 2024 against an import bill of US\$3.36 trillion. Major imported products include electrical machinery and equipment - US\$531 billion, vehicles and parts - US\$391 billion, mineral fuels and oils - US\$251 billion and pharmaceutical products - US\$212 billion. Meanwhile, major exports include petroleum products (crude and refined) - over US\$323 billion combined, motor vehicles - US\$152 billion, medical and biotech products - US\$90 billion, electronic integrated circuits - US\$43 billion, aircraft and parts -US\$124 billion. (Refer to Annex 6)








8. USA imports of Horticulture

The country imports over US\$50 billion of horticultural products. Major imported products include coffee, berries, citrus, pineapples, avocadoes and bananas. Zimbabwe is in a good position to be supplying some of these products as we have comparative advantage in producing them. (Refer to Annex 7)



9. Issues to consider

- AGOA: Zimbabwe is not benefiting from the trade agreement and if opportunity avails, it will be essential for the country to also benefit under the trade agreement.
- Shift in Trade Relations with South Africa: USA has been sourcing much of their products from South Africa and during the past few months there are signs that the relations may shift and this presents opportunities for Zimbabwe to supply the market as well.
- Enhance Diplomatic Relations: Strengthen diplomatic ties and establish regular communication channels between the two governments.
- Promote Business-to-Business Cooperation: Facilitate business-tobusiness interactions through trade fairs, conferences, and matchmaking events.
- Improve Export led Infrastructure: Invest in transportation and logistics infrastructure to facilitate trade and investment flows.

10. Conclusion

By addressing these challenges and capitalizing on the opportunities, Zimbabwe and United States of America can forge strong economic ties and contribute to mutual prosperity. Issues to tackle include Government-to-Government Cooperation which can foster stronger diplomatic ties and high-level visits. Private Sector Engagement can lead to business-to-business interactions and joint ventures between companies from both countries which can foster enhanced trade.



Annex 4: Zimbabwe Export Potential



The products with the greatest export potential from Zimbabwe to the United States are gold, unwrought, for non-monetary purposes, ferro-chromium, >=4% carbon, and jewellery of precious metal, n.e.s.. Gold, unwrought, for non-monetary purposes shows the largest absolute difference between potential and actual exports in value terms, leaving room to realize additional exports worth US\$43 million.
